Intrinsic items

- I1. I try hard to carry my religion over into all my other dealings in life.

 - E6. I pray chiefly because I have been taught to pray.
 - E7. A primary reason for my interest in religion is that my church is a congenial social activity.
 - E8. Occasionally I find it necessary to compromise my religious beliefs in order to protect my social and economic well-being.
 - E9. The primary purpose of prayer is to gain relief and protection.
 - E10. Although I believe in my religion, I feel there are many more important things in my life.
 - E11. Religion helps to keep my life balanced and steady in exactly the same way as my citizenship, friendships, and other memberships do.
 - E12. One reason for my being a church member is that such membership helps to establish a person in the community.
